

History

For nearly 30 years, the Pennsylvania Council for International Education (PaCIE) has worked to strengthen international education in Pennsylvania. PaCIE was established at The Pennsylvania State University in 1969 by the four Pennsylvania research universities to seek funds for collaborative projects and to hold an annual conference open to all colleges and universities in the Commonwealth. While originally set up to help educational institutions seek state and federal funding, over the years PaCIE has carried out a wide range of projects and programs. PaCIE has:

- Awarded Penn PaCIE grants to 55 colleges and universities, including:
PaCIE International Education Grants to 25 PA colleges, 1983-1988
PaCIE International Education and Geography Grants to 30 PA colleges and universities, 1988-1992
- Organized nine state-wide pre-college and college collaboratives of language and social studies faculty members;
- Applied distance learning technology for the orientation to and re-entry after study abroad programs;
- Founded the Pennsylvania Governor's School in International Education;
- Sponsored, since 1970, an annual two-day conference in late September, early October open to members and others throughout the state;
- Published a newsletter carrying information on various facets of international education in Pennsylvania

Today

PaCIE's membership today includes educators from Commonwealth two-year and four-year colleges and universities throughout Pennsylvania. As we continue to serve as an advocate for international education, PaCIE:

- Continues to hold an annual conference, publish the PaCIE Newsletter, and maintains a website;
- Continues to seek funding for Pennsylvania colleges and universities in support of international education;
- Seeks the active participation of Pennsylvania two-year and four-year colleges and universities and school districts in international activities;
- Works to strengthen international education across the Commonwealth through collaborative projects among its member institutions;
- Seeks innovative ways of using technology in international education;
- Seeks to advocate for partnerships in international education with legislators, state-wide business and educational associations.
